LILLE — THE GATEWAY TO EUROPE

Lille has a population of one million and with six European capitals within a 250-kilometre radius (London, Paris, Luxembourg, Bonn, Brussels and The Hague) it is set to become the major trade and cultural centre in Northern Europe. Brussels is 90 minutes away by train and Paris 2 hours. These times will be reduced when the high-speed TGV link comes into operation between London, Brussels, Paris and Bonn.

The traditional capital of Flanders, Lille is a lively University town with theatres, historic houses, and its own symphony orchestra. It houses the second most important provincial art museum in France. The annual 'Festival de Lille' with a country-specific theme (in 1992 it is Great Britain) is a major cultural event which coincides with IATEFL's own Conference.

The Conference will be hosted by EDHEC, L'Ecole des Hautes Etudes Commerciales, a part of the Catholic University of Lille. There will be a Jubilee dinner, and the publishers' exhibition as usual. We are expecting at least 800 members, including representatives of IATEFL Branches and Affiliates from all over the world.

There will be a choice of accommodation of different grades in hotels in Lille arranged by the Lille Tourist Board. A crèche has been planned in a nursery school adjacent to the University.
